Get Healthy with Audrey: COVID-19 Vaccines & Testing

If you are looking into getting vaccinated against COVID-19, it's good to know that Florida is increasing supplies and access. Vaccine availability will vary from day to day as they work to provide vaccines to the most vulnerable first. Currently, the state is prioritizing persons 65 and older, health care personnel with direct patient contact, residents and staff of long-term care facilities, and person extremely vulnerable to COVID-19.

Testing sites sponsored by the state of Florida are free and open to the public. If you want to get tested, know what type of test you are looking for.

- A diagnostic test show if you have a current infection. Tests are sent to an outside lab, and results are available within several days. These tests are considered very accurate.
- A rapid test is another type of diagnostic test that makes results available in minutes if analyzed onsite in a testing center. These test may be less accurate and miss some cases.
- An antigen test is a newer test that detects certain proteins that are part of the virus and can produce results in minutes. A positive antigen test results is considered very accurate, but there's an increased chance of false negative results - meaning it's possible to be infected with the virus but have negative antigen test results.
- An antibody test reveals if you had a past infection. It might not show if you have a current infection because it can take 1-3 weeks after infection to make antibodies. Having antibodies to the virus that causes COVID-19 might provide protection from getting infected with the virus again. If it does, it is unknown how much protection the antibodies might provide or how long this protection might last.

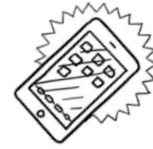
